#### Wise Gifts

The Wise Men are representative of all of us. The bible doesn't actually say there were just three men, only that there were three gifts,



gifts that are very symbolic of what we all should be offering to the beautiful manifestation of Light to our universe: Jesus the Messiah.

**Gold for Kingship.** When we make Jesus the ruler of our hearts and our lives, we are offering him pure gold. Making Jesus the King of one's life is no small matter because every personal kingdom of ours has small pockets where we reserve kingship for ourselves, places where we are totally reluctant to give up autonomy, places where we fool ourselves and believe that whatever we feel and perceive is what Jesus feels and perceives. If these little areas have hovels of righteous anger or mounds of resentments and angers that keep tripping us up, Jesus is not King.

Frankincense for worship. When we worship Jesus – and I mean really worship him in our hearts and souls, not just show up for Mass – we are offering him the beautiful aroma of our love. But this offer of worship doesn't just benefit Jesus or stroke his ego; when we truly worship, we also receive benefits. Frankincense has a woody and sweet aroma and is said to diminish feelings of stress and anxiety. Stress and anxiety are byproducts of trying to be kings of certain areas of our lives. When we worship Christ with our whole hearts and souls, we are signifying to ourselves who is really King of our lives and who will win in the end.

**Myrrh for consecration.** Myrrh was used for embalming in Jesus's day but it was also used in the temple to consecrate priests. We are all called to the Royal Priesthood, consecrated at our baptisms. When we consciously walk as consecrated priests, we are bringing Christ's priesthood to life and offering him a permanent and active place in our lives and our ministries.

May we all live as wise people and may we all bear these gifts to the Lord.

The Syro-Malabar Catholic Church is an Eastern Catholic Church that traces its origins to the evangelistic activity of St. Thomas the Apostle in 1st century. St. Thomas, one of the 12 Apostles, traveled to India after the Pentecostal experience to proclaim the Good News. He landed in Kerala, India in 52 A.D. and founded the Christian Communities and later known as Saint Thomas Christians. From 1887 Saint Thomas Christians named as Syro-Malabar Church in order to keep the identity. The Syro-Malabar Church is primarily based in India and has four eparchies outside India. One of the eparchies is based in Mississauga, Canada. Bishop of Mississauga, Bishop Jose Kalluvelil established St. Anthony's Syro-Malabar mission in Victoria on 25th February 2016. Until now a priest from Vancouver used to visit the Island once a month and celebrated Holy Mass for the Syro-Malabar community. This month we got a new priest, Fr. Shijo George Ottaplackal who is also the assistant pastor at St. Joseph the worker parish in Victoria, British Columbia.

Fr. Shijo George took charge of Syro-Malabar mission from Fr. Thomas Venmanthara on 15th December 2023.


