# **State of the Nations**

The Gospel for today says, "All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another..." The word 'people' in older translations was more correctly translated as 'them'. The Greek word there is *autous*, which means 'them'. It would seem to be a small matter as to which word is used but it has had a major impact on how we view this passage. The 'them' in this passage is referring back to the nations gathered before God, not to individual people.



Matthew wrote his gospel for the Jews and his main purpose was to show how Jesus was indeed the promised Messiah or King. The Jews

never thought in terms of individual salvation but in terms of corporate or national salvation and Matthew is saying that <u>all</u> nations are under Christ's kingship, not just the nation of Israel.

*Nations* will be judged for how the powerless, the poor and the marginalized are treated by the prevailing systems that are in place and it's not hard to find nations where the wants of the elite are attended to while the marginalized are left to their suffering. What Jesus is saying is simple. Nations that tend to the least will flourish while nations that neglect the least will engender more and more fire within their own systemic violence. In those instances, the fire never ends and the violence never ceases. It's sheer hell that goes on forever.

Christ is the King who came to show what true kingship is like. In his kingdom the poor, the sick, the prisoners, and the refugees are his beloved people, extensions of himself and the recipients of his loving mercy. He administers an economy of grace and healing, not of wealth, power and might. He is a king who makes no sense to leaders who pander to the rich and powerful. To open borders to refugees or to designate valuable resources to people who have nothing and are helpless is totally unthinkable to them.

Lord, let your unthinkable kingdom come. Let your unthinkable will be done. Amen!
