To Be or Not To Be A King

All hail King Jesus!

But while we're all hailing him, perhaps we should spend a bit of time considering whether our hailing is serious or whether we're just paying lip service while quietly installing ourselves as kings in our own little kingdoms where we all have a proclivity for rising up defensively when challenged. It's human nature to set up territories and boundaries and to react when someone who just doesn't get that we have the right and authority to be in charge is threatening those boundaries. The kinds of reactions we have and the offense we take when we feel diminished or disregarded by another tells us that we have no idea what a king really is according to Jesus' definition of a king. Jesus might actually be happy to allow us to be the kings of our territories if we realized what kingship in the Kingdom of God involves.

It means that having power over others is the last thing a true king reaches for. It means being so loving and humble that insisting on one's own way, demanding respect or refusing to see wounds in anyone but oneself is a way that is utterly foreign. It means sacrificing self for the sake of others. A true king has no attachment to receiving all due respect and has little interest in accolades, admiration, adulation or worldly perks of success. A true king does not rule by control but by service.

That's how Jesus walked as a King upon this earth and that's how he rules as a king in the Kingdom of God. He does not strong-arm us into submissiveness – he loves us into fullness. He teaches by example. If you are ready to rule the way Jesus does...

...then go ahead. Choose your kingdom.

There will be a private ballot election for two positions to the CISDV Board of Directors at this meeting. Each position is for a three-year term.




