God's Neighborhood

"Who is my neighbor?" That's a pretty simple question and I think, for the most part, everyone understands the answer that there is no one who is not my neighbor. Whether it's someone of a different race, religion, political perspective or spiritual perspective, we are all called to love and serve one another.

The beautiful thing about this parable is that Jesus did not imply in any way that there were any prerequisites for the man who was beaten and robbed to receive mercy. The Good Samaritan generously helped him, no questions asked. The priest and the Levite immediately assumed the man was unworthy. According to Jewish belief at the time, the kind of misfortune the man experienced was one that only sinners would experience. Their inner response might have been, "You probably deserved it."

This parable is certainly good spiritual direction for us: have mercy on everyone without judgement, and I think most people at least try to practice this. But this parable is also good news for us. Jesus taught nothing that the Trinity does not practice. God doesn't have one set of precepts for us and a different set for himself. Have you ever thought of yourself as God's neighbor? When life has beaten you down and robbed you of your dignity and self-sufficiency, do you ever feel like God has crossed to the other side of the road and is judging you within the situation and judging your responses to it?

If God asks his people to love their neighbors as they love themselves, the truth is that God loves you as he loves himself. Wow! God does not remove himself when you are in need, are in pain or are living unconsciously. He doesn't condemn or criticize or tell you to get yourself together before he will help you. He picks you up and cares for you and instructs others to care for you as well. God is the Good Samaritan.

Makes you think, doesn't it?







PILGRIMAGE TO HOLY LAND

Under spiritual leadership of Fr. Dean Henderson, Pastor Our Lady of the Rosary in Langford

February 14 - 23, 2023 - 10 days - \$4,290.00 (Victoria Dep., incl all taxes and tips)





- Feb. 14 Morning departure from Victoria to Tel Aviv.
- Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 16 After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross – Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.
- Feb. 20 After breakfast we visit Bethlehem where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome – Shepherd's field. In the afternoon we continue our visit of Jerusalem's Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 21 This morning we leave for a full day excursion to the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947, and Jericho. Time for floating before our return to hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 22 After breakfast we depart to Mount of Olives in Jerusalem where we visit the Church of all Nations, the Church of Maria Magdalene, Dominus Flevit Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, Mary's Tomb, Church of the Pater Noster. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight
- Feb. 23 This morning we are transferred to the airport in Tel Aviv for a flight to Victoria. Evening arrival.


