Gentle Light and Salt

Last week I wrote about the beatitude of gentleness. This week, the Gospel speaks about being the salt of the earth and the light of the world. I state my case: gentleness is salt and light.

Not hiding our light under a bushel is mostly thought of as being willing to stand up and say, "Yes, I follow Jesus." That may be part of it but every time we give in to bad temper or aggressively and angrily insist on our own way or become verbally abusive in our quest for justice, we most effectively shove our light under a barrel and our saltiness is rendered totally flat. How can the world (or our fellow Christians and families) recognize the light of Christ when we are acting so entitled in the same way everyone else in the world acts?

Imagine that the bushel barrel that Christ speaks of is the container that holds all the reactions to life and other people that the rest of the world habitually engages in. When we allow anger, aggression, resentment, retaliation, outbursts of bad temper and non-forgiveness etc. to take over our emotions, it's as if we dump this bushel barrel of garbage all over ourselves, crawl under the barrel and refuse to budge. The light is not only hidden but it's eventually snuffed out from lack of Kingdom air. Getting it rekindled is extremely difficult because living under that barrel is addictive. We want to be there. Then our saltiness has truly lost its flavor and is only fit for trampling on. It's completely void of usefulness.

The gentle person does not react. The gentle one responds. The gentle one does not hold grudges and does not subject others to the abuse of anger but, rather, forgives and has compassion. The gentle Christian lives out the love chapter of 1 Corinthians 13. The gentle one's light softly glows for all to see and the light is inviting and warm. The salt of the gentle soul is a subtle and welcome flavor enhancer.

Is being salt and light easy? Nope.

It's just critical.






