The First Step of a Lenten Pilgrimage

The temptations in the desert are a great illustration of the difference between fulfilling (interpreting correctly) the law and abolishing (misinterpreting) the law. Satan deliberately misinterprets the law in order to tempt Jesus to believe that natural desires are totally valid. In fact, what Satan was trying to subtly lead Jesus into could be summed up as the temptation to ask, "What's in it for me if I really am the Son of God?"

How about your reality? If you are a child of God, are there not some subtle scriptural misinterpretations floating around making you feel that if you were a real child of God, you would have more and be more? Do you feel like there should be more miracles or more 'spiritual successes'? Do you sometimes wish God would just scoop you up, feed you, heal you and set you on top of the world?

Jesus did not fall into these temptations to yearn after a false reality, because Satan was basing his temptations on the hope that Jesus didn't fully know who he really was. "If you are the Son of God, then..." But Satan failed because Jesus did indeed know exactly who he was. He wasn't just the Son of God; he was the Beloved Son of God. Everything Satan showed to Jesus was, in Satan's mind, the epitome of all that was to be coveted but Jesus had absolutely no desire to emulate Satan's base desires. All Jesus desired was to be the Beloved and to do his Father's will. He didn't want to have bread; he wanted to be bread. He didn't want miracles that would cause awe and admiration; he wanted to be The Miracle for all the world. He didn't want to conquer and rule the world; he wanted to bring the world home.

The exciting news is that we, too, are invited to discover who we are (Beloved!) and to begin the journey away from the temptations of false expectations and to begin the pilgrimage to a life of true Kingdom desire.

Are his love and his grace enough for us?


