Lighten Up

Last week I wrote about Jesus travelling light. He did not weigh himself down with all the stuff we consider 'inner necessities' like carving a place for himself in the world and making sure everyone respected him, fully accepted his perspective and admired him for his accomplishments etc. He honestly didn't care if people knew he was the guy doing all the healing and other miracles. He knew that needing recognition was a burden that would bog him down.

This week he is passing on that critical lesson to his disciples. *"Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals,"* It was actually quite common for travellers not to carry a bag of food or a purse of money. Hospitality in Israel was a high priority so nobody would starve on the road. But it was significant that Jesus told them not to wear sandals. Going barefoot signified humility, lack of social status and spiritual poverty. That was a reminder to his disciples not to start getting attached to their mission or think of themselves as 'special'.

When the disciples came back all excited because even the demons submitted to them, Jesus basically said, "Chill. Calm down. Your success is not yours and you don't own it. Don't get all excited about your accomplishments as if it means something about you. Get excited instead about the fact that you are a beloved child of God. That's your whole identity and it's all you need. You don't need admiration, power or status. I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven because of his desire for these things." Jesus wasn't putting them down; he was trying to make the journey easier for them.

Jesus was constantly trying to lighten the disciple's inner loads by enlightening their perspective on self-importance and recognition. *"Unless you become as little children..."* But I don't think the disciples really understood what he was talking about until after Pentecost. Then the lightbulbs started to go on. They weren't there to claim territory. It was all God's territory. They were just pilgrims sharing Good News on their way home...

...at the speed of lightness.

PILGRIMAGE TO HOLY LAND

Under spiritual leadership of Fr. Dean Henderson, Pastor
Our Lady of the Rosary in Langford

February 14 – 23, 2023 – 10 days - \$4,290.00 (Victoria Dep., incl all taxes and tips)



- Feb. 14 Morning departure from Victoria to Tel Aviv.
- Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 16 After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana – the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor – the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross – Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.
- Feb. 20 After breakfast we visit Bethlehem – where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome – Shepherd's field. In the afternoon we continue our visit of Jerusalem's Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 21 This morning we leave for a full day excursion to the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947, and Jericho. Time for floating before our return to hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 22 After breakfast we depart to Mount of Olives in Jerusalem where we visit the Church of all Nations, the Church of Maria Magdalene, Dominus Flevit Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, Mary's Tomb, Church of the Pater Noster. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 23 This morning we are transferred to the airport in Tel Aviv for a flight to Victoria. Evening arrival.

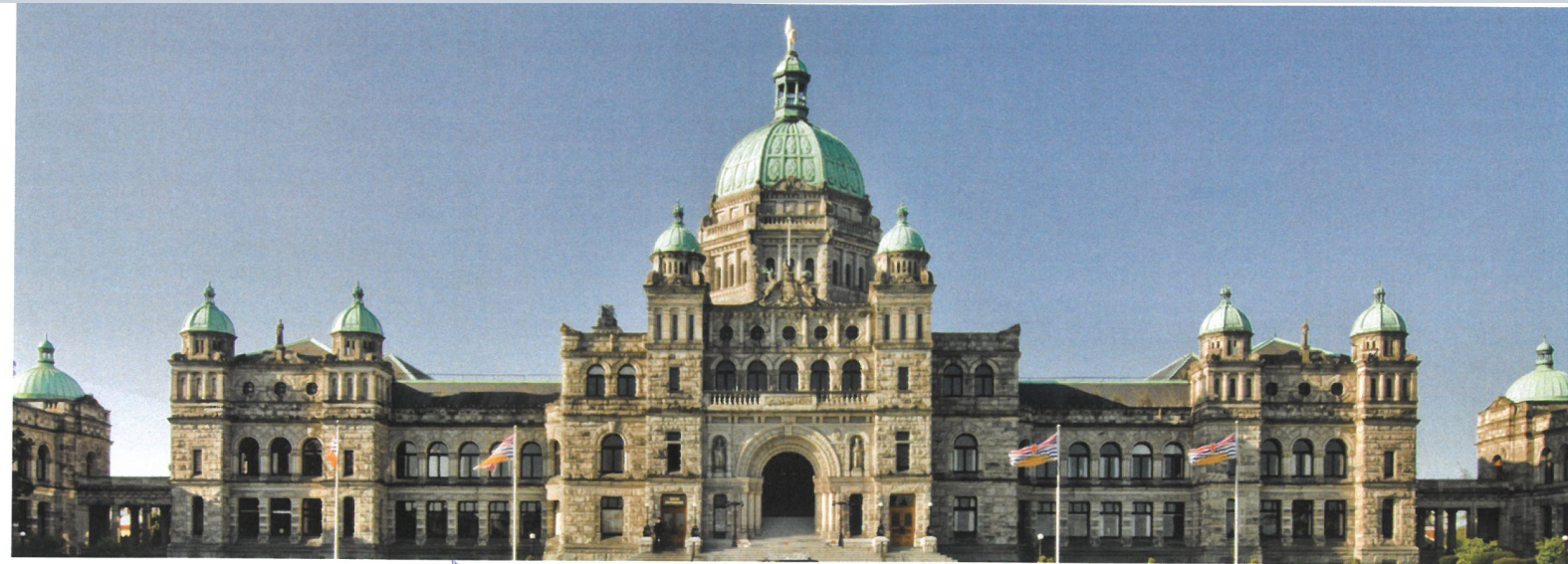
