## Warning: Cliffs Ahead

Missing from last week's reflection was the important opening paragraph. In it I wrote that Jesus did *not* read the part from Isaiah that said "and the day of vengeance of our God". The Jews at that time were unhealthily focused on 'righteous vengeance' (an eye for an eye) and on defending God's Holy Name. Even though Jesus tried to focus their hearts on a forgiving and healing God rather than a vengeful one, he knew the outcome of his gracious words. He knew the outcome in his hometown and he knew the outcome of his entire ministry.

How do you change minds and hearts that have lived for eons based on the premise that God is vengeful? Jesus came to do that but I think he knew it wouldn't happen overnight in the mighty and earthshaking events of his death and resurrection. The truth is, he is still patiently waiting for most people to catch up with him. He's waiting for people to read his teachings and receive the epiphany that his recorded words are gracious, life giving, radical and absolutely critical to our spiritual walk. They are not secondary to the Sacrament of the Eucharist. If we receive the Body and Blood of our Lord but are not paying a lot of attention to his Word, especially to his commandment that we love one another as he has loved us, then we are basically throwing our Lord off a cliff. Conversely, if we try to follow his teachings without his sacramental grace, we will find it an onerous chore. The two go hand in hand. And right along beside them stands love for Christ's presence in his people.

Are you trying hard to follow Christ's teachings? Do you often fail and feel guilty? Fear not. This is the time to remember that when Jesus finished reading from Isaiah, the people were "amazed at his gracious words". They were words of hope not words of condemnation and vengeance.

Graciousness is his nature – and should be part of ours.

### Message from the Chancery: Update January 20, 2022

Please see the latest update to the General and Liturgical Directives for churches during Covid-19, to be followed by all parishes in the Diocese of Victoria. #### In Summary:

- The requirements for worship services remain the same
- Gatherings such as catechism, parish meetings, or receptions immediately following regular liturgical services
  may be held according to the requirements for worship services. However, we strongly recommend they are
  held virtually whenever possible
- Wedding receptions, funeral receptions and gatherings for the purpose of acknowledging or celebrating a significant event (eg, baptism receptions) are not permitted in church buildings at this time
- Non-worship gatherings in church buildings are now permitted as long as all regulations of the latest "Gatherings and Events" and "Face Coverings" Orders of the Provincial Health Officer are followed
- Essential gatherings such as drug and alcohol support group meetings, or the distribution of food or other supplies to people in need, may happen in church buildings without any restrictions


