The Best of All

This week's short Gospel is taken from a much longer passage where Jesus is talking to the Pharisees about his role as the Shepherd of his people. His words are pretty inflammatory because he is referring to the prophecies of Ezekiel. You would be familiar with some of the words of Ezekiel from the hymn, "Like A Shepherd". The second verse says, "I myself will shepherd them, for others have led them astray, the lost I will rescue and heal their wounds, and pasture them giving them rest." That's pretty much directly from Ezekiel. (Ch. 34)

In Ezekiel, God rips into the religious leaders of the Israelites for leading his people astray and not caring for their needs like good shepherds should. Therefore, he says, he himself will look after his flocks and care for them. When Jesus tells the Pharisees that he is the Good Shepherd and that the sheep know his voice, he is blatantly equating them to the bad shepherds in Ezekiel who neglected the people and only took care of their own needs and desires. He is also obviously proclaiming himself to be God or the True Shepherd. The Pharisees would have had to have been pretty dim not to know what Jesus is really saying about them and about himself. It was another nail in his cross.

I love it that Jesus says, "What my Father has given me is greater than all else and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand..." What the Father has given Jesus is us. To God, we are greater than all else and so precious to him that he will allow no one to snatch us away. No one. Just let them try!

We are his people, the sheep of his flock. Such beautiful words but let's bring that closer to home. Say to yourself, "To God, I am greater than everything else and no one and nothing can snatch me away from him. No one. Nothing."

This, my brothers and sisters, is powerful Agape Love!





Update during COVID April 6, 2022

Please click on the link below to the Diocesan website to access the *General and Liturgical Directives and Music Ministry Covid-19 Prevention Plan*, to be followed by all parishes in the Diocese of Victoria.

The key updates include:

- Face coverings must be worn by priests and deacons when in close proximity to people during Baptisms,
 Confirmations, and Anointing of the Sick; during processions through the congregation; while greeting people before and after mass; and when distributing Holy Communion
- Face coverings must also be worn by other ministers of Communion while distributing Communion
- Face coverings are strongly recommended for all people while in church buildings, especially for those who come into close proximity to others, and while participating in congregational singing
- There may be more than one lector for the Proclamation of the Word and the intercessory prayers
- The offertory procession of the gifts for the altar may resume, provided the bread and wine remain covered both before and during the procession
- In the rare situation where a person is unable to use their hands while receiving Communion, the minister of Communion must sanitize their hands before and after giving Holy Communion to the person


