Divine Desire

Maybe we should lay to rest the term 'Doubting Thomas'. I think it would be more accurate to call him, 'Desiring Thomas' and we all could aspire to be a little more like him. Faith based on just the word of other people is an amazing thing but a person who insists on a personal encounter with the one he or she is being encouraged to believe in may experience something and Someone far bigger than what anyone could have imagined.

When Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" (Ho Theos!), he proclaimed something no other disciple had ever understood before. Through a gifted revelation, Thomas realized that Jesus isn't just the Son of God. Thomas realized that Jesus is God. Peter had said that Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of the living God, which Jesus said flesh and blood had not revealed to him, but even Peter had not yet clued in to the ultimate understanding that Jesus is God. That was a revelation reserved for Thomas, a revelation that could not have been given by flesh and blood.

Why was Thomas so blessed? Because he desired it with all his heart. He didn't just want head knowledge of the risen Christ; he wanted intimacy with him. He felt deeply wounded by missing out on Jesus' appearance to the other disciples. He wanted experience, not their words. Jesus cannot resist that. At the right moment he will always come to anyone who yearns for his gaze and his touch.

Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." I doubt if Jesus was talking to just Thomas at that point. All the disciples present believed because they had seen Jesus. All of them, including Thomas, would become the Christophers (Christ Bearers) to a community who would believe without seeing and would indeed be blessed but Thomas, especially, would also be witness to the fact that God himself will come in love to anyone who greatly desires an encounter:


Diocese of Victoria Bursaries & Awards Deadline July 15, 2022

Update during COVID April 6, 2022

The key updates include:

- · Face coverings must be worn by priests and deacons when in close proximity to people during Baptisms, Confirmations, and Anointing of the Sick; during processions through the congregation; while greeting people before and after mass; and when distributing Holy Communion
- Face coverings must also be worn by other ministers of Communion while distributing Communion
- · Face coverings are strongly recommended for all people while in church buildings, especially for those who come into close proximity to others, and while participating in congregational singing
- There may be more than one lector for the Proclamation of the Word and the intercessory prayers
- The offertory procession of the gifts for the altar may resume, provided the bread and wine remain covered both before and during the procession
- . In the rare situation where a person is unable to use their hands while receiving Communion, the minister of Communion must sanitize their hands before and after giving Holy Communion to the person


