You, Too, Can Fulfill the Law!

Jesus said that he did not come to abolish the law but to fulfill it. What might make this a little easier to understand is to know that to 'fulfill the law' is a Jewish idiom that means to properly interpret the Torah so people can obey it *as God intends*. Additionally, to 'abolish the law' means to undermine the Torah by misinterpreting it. Jesus was instructing his disciples that he had come to properly interpret the true intent of the law, not to offer bad interpretations such as what the Pharisees were teaching.

Jesus then goes on to teach what are called 'The Antitheses'. *"You have heard it said...but I say to you..."* and his teachings seem rather harsh. This is where we learn that to be angry with a brother or sister carries the same weight as murder. Yeah. It does seem harsh. But if you remember the beatitudes that we heard two Sundays ago, the Antitheses are simply an extension of the true interpretation of Torah, what God had originally intended, an interpretation no one had been taught. The law of the Torah was nicely summed up in Micah 6:8. *"He has shown you, o people, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you but to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?"*

The law of the Torah was given to keep people from selfishness, covetousness, strife and finally violence, sacred or otherwise, big acts of violence or small, seemingly insignificant ones. The beatitudes and the Antitheses are a distillation of the true intention of the law. The Pharisees had misinterpreted the law to basically mean, *"Follow our purity codes and keep making sacrifices for every small infraction."* Jesus's interpretation was *"Be pure of heart. Be gentle like me. From those two qualities there will be a natural (or supernatural!) flow of mercy, compassion and forgiveness."*

Seek first the Kingdom of God and the rest will be added to you. It's not harsh.

It's true Life.

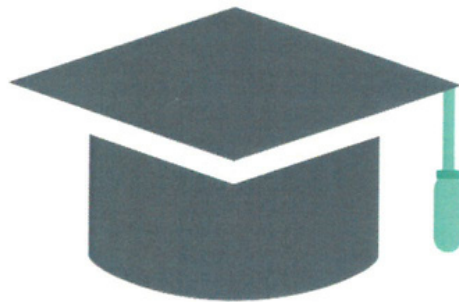
