The Sacred Journey Continues

When Jesus was baptized, he opened up the way for our baptisms. When he died on the Cross, he sanctified and made holy all our crucifixions in life. When he rose from the dead, he forged a path of hope so we would know that our sufferings will lead to a new and resurrected life, time after time. But how can we relate to the Ascension? What has that got to do with us here and now in the midst of life that is often messy, confusing and painful?

When Jesus ascended, even though to the disciples it looked like he was going far away, what he was really doing was finally entering fully into his true home and his true being. He had left behind his limited humanity in the tomb and in the ascension he showed us our real destination: our true home and our true being. That can't be just for the end of our natural lives because God became human to show us the way to be fully alive in this life, not just so we get to heaven when we die.

Before he ascended, he opened the disciples' minds to understand the scriptures in relation to who he was. If our understanding of scripture doesn't lead us to worship Christ with great joy daily and in the Temple Courts, then we need to pray that he will open our minds as well so we can leave our limited humanity (for us that's our egos) in the tomb and be prepared to enter into our true home and our true selves. Christ's ascension is not just a 'pie in the sky when you die' story; it is a critical part of our path and an essential part of our personal stories. We are called to a continually higher and deeper discovery of Home. Wherever Christ goes, he wants us to follow.

2022 Father Leo Roberts Bursary Eligibility Requirements

- Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.
- Strong academic marks with experience in church, community involvement and volunteer work.
- Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.
- A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: **\$2000** per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

Deadline: Thursday, June 30, 2022



Update during COVID April 6, 2022

Please click on the link below to the Diocesan website to access the *General and Liturgical Directives and Music Ministry Covid-19 Prevention Plan*, to be followed by all parishes in the Diocese of Victoria.

The key updates include:

- Face coverings must be worn by priests and deacons when in close proximity to people during Baptisms,
 Confirmations, and Anointing of the Sick; during processions through the congregation; while greeting people before and after mass; and when distributing Holy Communion
- Face coverings must also be worn by other ministers of Communion while distributing Communion
- Face coverings are strongly recommended for all people while in church buildings, especially for those who come into close proximity to others, and while participating in congregational singing
- There may be more than one lector for the Proclamation of the Word and the intercessory prayers
- The offertory procession of the gifts for the altar may resume, provided the bread and wine remain covered both before and during the procession
- In the rare situation where a person is unable to use their hands while receiving Communion, the minister of Communion must sanitize their hands before and after giving Holy Communion to the person


