What Kind of Love Is This?

Two of the three times Jesus asked Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me," he used the word 'agape', which means divine unconditional love or the ultimate form of sacrificial love. But both times, when Peter answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you," Peter used the word 'phileo', which means brotherly love. Jesus was obviously asking the critical question, "Simon, do you love me unconditionally, more than you love your friends, your possessions and your life?" Peter, who still had difficulty understanding divine unconditional love, answered according to his own capacity to understand. To Peter, phileo love was the highest form of love he could grasp: brothers and sisters living together in mutual caring, respect and support.

Surprisingly, the third time Jesus asks, he does not persist but meets Peter exactly where Peter is and uses the word 'phileo'. This was not Jesus being patronizing. This was a gracious Jesus displaying true agape love, the beautiful divine love that does not chastise for a lack of understanding but is a patient and unanxious love that allows limited understanding to grow and develop within experience.

Jesus didn't love and call Peter because of his intellectual or theological prowess; he loved Peter for his eagerness to receive forgiveness and follow. Jesus knew that with the coming of the Holy Spirit Peter would begin to experience the fullness of agape love within himself and the flowing of that love would build and sustain a dynamic new Church.

It's no secret that the Peter before Pentecost and the Peter after were two different Peters. The first was brash, impulsive, cowardly and full of himself. The second was bold but prayed before he acted, was full of the Spirit and loved God's people without concern for his own safety. He moved in full agape love. He allowed himself to be loved by agape love and he freely gave it away. Agape love was Peter's key to the Kingdom. Agape love is our key to the Kingdom too.

Pray for it. The fullness of your life and your ministry depend on it.




Diocese of Victoria Bursaries & Awards Deadline July 15, 2022

Update during COVID April 6, 2022

Please click on the link below to the Diocesan website to access the General and Liturgical Directives and Music Ministry Covid-19 Prevention Plan, to be followed by all parishes in the Diocese of Victoria.

The key updates include:

- Face coverings must be worn by priests and deacons when in close proximity to people during Baptisms, Confirmations, and Anointing of the Sick; during processions through the congregation; while greeting people before and after mass; and when distributing Holy Communion
- Face coverings must also be worn by other ministers of Communion while distributing Communion
- Face coverings are strongly recommended for all people while in church buildings, especially for those who come into close proximity to others, and while participating in congregational singing
- There may be more than one lector for the Proclamation of the Word and the intercessory prayers
- The offertory procession of the gifts for the altar may resume, provided the bread and wine remain covered both before and during the procession
- In the rare situation where a person is unable to use their hands while receiving Communion, the minister of Communion must sanitize their hands before and after giving Holy Communion to the person
