#### The Well Experience

Jean Allen

One thing that always strikes me about the story of the woman at the well is how quickly and easily the people in her village listened to her and believed her. There are a couple of clues that she would have been an outcast in her village. First, she was at the well at noon, in the midday heat and no other village women were there. They would have come in the cool of the early morning to bring back water for their daily needs and she would not have felt welcome in their midst. Then Jesus deliberately asked her about her husband, to which she truthfully answered that she had had five husbands. Jesus concurs, mentioning that the one she had at present wasn't hers. Sadly, there are people even today who would have trouble accepting her word regarding something spiritually important but in biblical times she would have been an outcast on all levels.

Yet, it seems the villagers immediately responded to her invitation to come out and meet Jesus. Why? Was it because she had visibly changed? Had her countenance softened? Did she seem to be filled with an openness and inner glow whereas before that she was hard, defensive and strident? Was it that she even dared to approach them at all? Did Jesus imbue her with presence and power in her mission to share him with others?

We will never know but it is noteworthy nonetheless. Something deep happened to that woman, something that would not have happened if the conversation had been merely an intellectual one. It was something that could only come from having been face to face with Jesus, an occurrence that is still possible today.

Jesus would love to have a face to face encounter with you. He would love to speak to your inner objections and uncertainties; he would love to bring you to a place of total certainty. It might entail being told everything you've ever done. Ouch. But remember:

The woman at the well was totally O.K. with that.


