The Underground Pharisee

I have run into a few truly arrogant people in my lifetime but, thankfully, not many. Most people I know and have known are good people who don't think they are so much better than other people. It would seem that the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector has had an impact on the people of God.

But wait! Maybe the desire to feel better than others hasn't really been eliminated; maybe it has just been pushed into the subconscious. There is an old saying that you've all heard: "There, but for the grace of God, go I." It's supposed to show a kind of humility, an indication that if it wasn't for the grace and blessing of God, the speaker would be in the same boat as whichever wretch was being spotlighted. It might be marginally better than the arrogance of the Pharisee pointing out to God how good he was compared to the tax collector, but it is actually a kind of reverse arrogance. It is saying that we are under grace but obviously the addicts, the very poor, the ill, the homeless, the ones who don't have what we have, are not under God's grace and blessing.

The question is, what would put fortunate people under more grace than suffering people? Absolutely nothing. Any good fortune is not a sign of God's blessing because, inversely, that would mean that the ones who don't have good fortune are despised by God, which is what the Jews believed when Jesus walked the earth. It was also a notion that was completely abhorrent to Jesus. The Pharisee may have seen himself as justified but, meanwhile, Jesus was happily hanging out with the tax collectors, the prostitutes, the addicts, the sick, the homeless and the poor.

It is so hard for us humans to stop equating good fortune with true blessing. And so, the spirit of the Pharisee continues to live on underground.

Some humility can, indeed, be arrogance in disguise.

Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight. Feb. 16



Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana - the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate

Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor - the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the



Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.

Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross -Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.



Feb. 20 After breakfast we visit Bethlehem - where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome - Shepherd's field. In the afternoon we continue our visit of Jerusalem's Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight.

Feb. 21 This morning we leave for a full day excursion to the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947, and Jericho. Time for floating before our return to hotel for dinner and overnight.
