The Unveiling

Since Jesus spoke the words about what will happen before he returns, there probably hasn't been a time in history when people could not look around at world events and say, "The time must be near. Look how bad it is!" Wars, persecution, famines, earth quakes, other natural disasters, plagues...even today we can read the news and think, "The apocalypse must be near!"

The word 'apocalypse' does not mean a time of unprecedented disaster and violence. It means 'unveiling'. So, what is unveiled? If disasters, plagues and wars have always been with us, perhaps the apocalypse has been happening since Jesus's death and resurrection and what has been being unveiled all along is the self-justified violence of humans towards one another and the earth. We cannot deny that over the centuries, it has become more and more evident how human violence is a way of life.

But at the same time, what is also being unveiled is God's prodigious love and mercy. It's becoming harder and harder to commit so called 'sacred violence' in the name of God. We are all violent but God's goodness just keeps blossoming as we, the Church and the world, find ourselves stripped of any justification for keeping anyone downtrodden or excluded. God's mercy is being unveiled and, as the book of Wisdom said a couple of weeks ago, God overlooks people's sins so that they may repent.

You may be thinking, "Well, I'm not violent!" Think again. Do you ever lose your temper and feel justified in doing so? Are you completely free of all resentment and anger in regards to anything, be it your spouse, the government, a neighbor or a group? Inner resentment and anger are the seeds of all violence and Jesus said that if you have called someone a fool, you might as well have committed murder.

We need to be fully open to the apocalypse, the unveiling, of our own hearts and we need to be far more aware of the apocalytic unveiling of God's relentless mercy.

We need to be apocalypticized!




PILGRIMAGE TO HOLY LAND


Under spiritual leadership of Fr. Dean Henderson, Pastor Our Lady of the Rosary in Langford

February 14 - 23, 2023 - 10 days - \$4,290.00 (Victoria Dep., incl all taxes and tips)





Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight. Feb. 16



Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit

Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana - the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor - the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.



Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.

Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross -Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.
