Twelfth Sunday In Ordinary Time

### Be Not Afraid Matthew 10:26-33

Jesus said, "Fear no one, for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known." Jesus was sending his disciples out into the world to bring people the healing and power of the Good News and he was sending them knowing they were going into danger. Great violence was traditionally done to God's messengers in Israel's history, and often that violence ended in bloody death. Those who committed the murder covered it over and never acknowledged the secret that it was their own inner violence that demanded that 'Sacred Blood' and that God had nothing to do with it.

Jesus was sending his disciples out into a world full of violence, a world that could easily kill them and claim it was God's will. But Jesus says to them, "Do not be afraid! You are of more value than many sparrows."

A lot of people think that the one 'who can destroy both body and soul in hell' is God but Satan is the one who can destroy both body and soul in a hellish place. Satan was a 'murderer and a liar since the beginning', the one who successfully convinced humans that God was violent and required violence and sacrifice in order to please and appease him. Satan is the one who now successfully convinces us that our envy, our resentments and our anger are righteous and can be blamed on someone else, an attitude that keeps us chained to a cycle of 'righteous violence'.

Whenever Jesus says 'hell' in the Gospels, the Greek word used is actually Gehenna, which was the garbage dump outside of Jerusalem. Because fire was used to burn the garbage, people have assumed that Jesus meant a place of everlasting torture. However, before there was a garbage dump there, there was a place called the Valley of Ben Hinnom, which was a place where the Jews used to practice child sacrifice, a place that was hellish by it's very nature and abhorred by God. (Jeremiah 7:30-33) When we give in to our 'righteous anger' and our 'righteous judgements', we feed our inner violence and *we put ourselves back in that hellish place of violence and often call it sacred*. Jesus was warning his disciples that not only were they in danger of having violence done to them but they also were in danger of reacting in answering violence and in the process losing the Spirit of the one who sent them: the nonviolent Lamb of God.

If we fail, are violent and deny Jesus in front of humans, does that mean he will refuse to acknowledge us for eternity? I don't think so! If denying him means spending an eternity excluded from his presence, then what about Peter who denied him three times? What about the other disciples who abandoned him for fear of being associated with him? Jesus totally forgave them all. It is the Father's will and Jesus' good pleasure to forgive wholly and utterly.

How many times will he forgive us? Seventy times seven? How about 'eternally'?
