No Quid Pro Quo

Many scripture scholars and theologians struggle with this week's parable of the king who slaughtered all those who ignored his invitation to the wedding banquet and then threw out a guest because he wasn't dressed properly, because the most common interpretation that sees the king as representative of God portrays God as violent and vengeful, which does not jive with Christ's total message of compassion and forgiveness. Below, I will offer another possible interpretation that more than one scholar has come up with.

They believe that the king here is not representative of God but is representative of the violent and vindictive tendencies of human power. The powerful king first sends out invitations to all the well to do but the moment he is spurned he turns into a raging tyrant and angrily slaughters those who reject him. Then the king invites the poor and the lowly. The poor can't turn him down because they are powerless and afraid after seeing what happened to the first lot of invitees. Then when this fearsome tyrant walks among his guests, he is brought up short by a guest with no proper garment. Confronted, the guest is 'speechless'. He is silent.

Might this unfortunate guest be Jesus, a man who had little and would only be considered good enough for the second tier of invitations and a man who did not strive to fit with the norm? Very shortly after this parable, Jesus was silent before his accusers and then he was bound and cast out into the darkness.

But how could Jesus say, "The Kingdom of heaven is like..." and then describe a violent despot similar to Herod? In Matthew 11, Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven suffers violence and the violent take it by force." So, God's kingdom is not invulnerable to human violence; however, the Kingdom does not inflict violence in return. Hence the silent, unresisting guest, who allows himself to be bound and cast out.

So, beware: we can, and do, inflict violence on the Kingdom of Heaven.

The study is based upon a practice called Lectio Divina taught by St Benedict (born 480 in Italy) to his monks.

- 1. **Listen** to the short bible verses for a verse that speaks to your heart and relates to your life experience.
- 2. **Meditate/ Reflect** on the message the Holy Spirit seems to be saying to you. Talk with the Lord about what the passage brought to your heart.
- 3. **Rest** with God. Be aware of God's presence with you. Be silent. Listen for His voice.
- 4. **Copy** your verse on a card (provided) for memorization. You can keep the verse in your pocket. Keep saying your verse between meetings. In this way you are hearing God's voice in your daily life.



PILGRIMAGE TO MEXICO

Under spiritual leadership of Fr. Dean Henderson, Pastor Our Lady of the Rosary in Langford

Feb. 23 - Mar. 1, 2024 - 8 days - \$3,390.00 (Vancouver Dep, Incl. all taxes and tips)



Feb. 23 Afternoon departure from Victoria via Vancouver to Mexico City. Upon arrival transfer to hotel for overnight.

Feb. 24 After breakfast we are transferred to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe for welcome Mass. Continue to the "City of Angels"- Puebla for dinner and overnight.



We start the day with a tour to the old city, the Cathedral, Dominican Cloister and the Rosary Chapel. Continue to Tlaxcala and the Shrine of San Miguel del Milagro. Celebrate Mass at the site where St Michael the Archangel appeared to Diego Lazaro in 1631 directing him to the Grotto and to a well of miraculous waters. See the image of Our Lady of Ocotlan burnt into a tree trunk after she appeared to Diego Bernardino in 1531. Perfectly preserved, the image in a tree resides in the Basilica of Our Lady of Ocotlan. Dinner and overnight in Puebla.

After breakfast we visit the small Indian baroque church of Tonantzintla and Cholula Church constructed on the top of Great Pyramid. Continue to the famous "Silver City"- Taxco. We get acquainted with the history of silver mining in Mexico, visit jewels of baroque style architecture - St Priscilla and St Sebastian Church where we celebrate Mass. Dinner and overnight in Taxco.



This morning we depart to Mexico City. Upon arrival we visit the Square of the Three Cultures and continue to the Old and the New Basilica dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe, visited by several million pilgrims every year, built near the location where Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to Juan Diego in 1531. We celebrate Mass and learn about the history of Our Lady of Guadalupe and Blessed Juan Diego. Dinner and overnight in Mexico City.

Feb. 28

After breakfast we travel to Teotihuacan and the largest American Pyramids, the pyramid of the Sun and the Moon as well as the Pyramid of the "Feathered Dragon", ranked among the biggest in the world. Special lunch on the way included. Some time for leisure. In the evening an optional performance of Ballet Folklórico de México in the Opera House and overnight.



Full day in Mexico City. We explore magnificent city center built on top of the ruins of the Aztec capital city. We stop at the Zocalo (main square), Palacio National. celebrate Mass in the Cathedral and drive along famous Paseo de la Reforma. Afternoon some free time for leisure. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
