### The Narrowing Gate

Last week I spoke of the critical importance of mercy and forgiveness. I wonder whether right between those two words is where the narrow gate resides.

We all know how narrow that gate can become when we are hurting and angry. The last thing we want to do is forgive and we make choices over and over again to hold the resentment and feed our anger because we are right and they are wrong. The longer we refuse to forgive, the narrower that gate becomes.

But still we say, "Lord, Lord! We ate and drank with you. You taught us in our churches." In the Gospel, Christ was not being high handed and snarky when he said, "I do not know where you come from." Those who refuse to forgive have *chosen* to remain outside the narrow gate. If we don't forgive and choose not to give mercy, we are choosing to live in a world that is not the Kingdom. Outside that gate, it doesn't matter if one has all the right words. If our mouths are also spewing resentment and violence towards those who hurt us, we are not Kingdom residents. We have chosen to live outside the gate. We are not victims without recourse. You never know, in the end, you may watch the person or people you have refused to forgive enter freely into the Kingdom while you find the gate too narrow and the squeeze too tight. The last one you think is worthy of the Kingdom may be one of the first to enter in.

Of course, if we choose to at least try to forgive and try to dispense mercy instead of vitriol, the gate widens immediately. We can peek through and tentatively say, "Lord?" and he will immediately respond,

"There you are! I was looking for you. Welcome home!"







Feb. 14 Morning departure from Victoria to Tel Aviv.

Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight. Feb. 16 After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit



Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana - the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we





Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.

Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem; St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross -Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.



After breakfast we visit Bethlehem - where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Feb. 20 Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome - Shepherd's field. In the afternoon we continue our visit of Jerusalem's Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St.

Peter's in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight. Feb. 21 This morning we leave for a full day excursion to the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947, and Jericho. Time for floating before our return to hotel for dinner and overnight.



Feb. 22 After breakfast we depart to Mount of Olives in Jerusalem where we visit the Church of all Nations, the Church of Maria Magdalene, Dominus Flevit Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, Mary's Tomb, Church of the Pater Noster, Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight

Feb. 23 This morning we are transferred to the airport in Tel Aviv for a flight to Victoria. Evening arrival.
