The Consequences of Unforgiveness

This week's Gospel is about the servant who was totally forgiven an enormous debt and then turned around and refused to forgive the relatively tiny debts of those who owed him money. We all listen to it and are a little outraged that someone could be so small minded, especially after receiving such incredible mercy from the master.

But wait a second. There is not one of us who is not supremely guilty of the same sin. God has gifted us with prodigious mercy and forgiveness yet we continually take offense against others and refuse to offer the same grace that has been given to us. We gratefully accept God's forgiveness of our transgressions and for a brief period we are dwelling in the Kingdom of grace. But the moment someone speaks disrespectfully to us, betrays our trust, is critical of our beliefs, ignores our perspectives or acts entitled to our service and we immediately choose to move out of the gracious Kingdom and we angrily choose to live in a realm where we will make that person pay the last penny. It is a realm bereft of grace. It is a hellish place to exist and it is often torture.

But make no mistake. We choose that place.

I am not implying that forgiveness is effortless or a matter of a quick and easy choice. Forgiveness is often horrendously difficult but God sees the heart and the desire to choose to live in the Kingdom of grace. It's not a matter of how well we succeed; it is a matter of how much we try and how hard and consistently we seek for God's help to forgive. We cannot do it without him.

When we forget how much we have been forgiven and refuse to even try to offer the same generous forgiveness and grace to anyone, whether it's a person, a group or even an institution or a government, it makes a mockery of God's merciful heart and it is a complete misrepresentation of Jesus. No wonder people turn away from the faith; they keep witnessing our disturbing distortions of who God really is.

No offense is worth that.

Newsworthy and Noteworthy

Season of Creation Week 3 Sept 17 - 23

Theme: Justice.

St. Francis shows us how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace." (LS 10) He helps us to take to heart what it means to be human.

The earth is essentially a shared inheritance, whose fruits are meant to benefit everyone. For believers, this becomes a question of fidelity to the Creator. (LS 93) Yet today we see injustice in the distribution of these fruits. In the deterioration of the environment and of society, it is the most vulnerable people on the planet who are most affected. (LS 48) Never have we so hurt and mistreated our common home as we have in the last two hundred years.

Today the Amazon reflects a wounded and deformed beauty. It is a place of pain and violence. Attacks on nature have consequences for people's lives.' (*Antonio Spadaro, .S.J.*) When nature is viewed solely as a source of profit and gain, this has serious consequences for society. (LS 82)

In a perspective of faith we challenge the dominant view of the economy 'which accepts every advance in technology with a view to profit, without concern for its potentially negative impact on human beings. Employing technology as a mere instrument is nowadays inconceivable. (LS 107) We fail to see the deepest roots of our present failures, which have to do with direction, goals, meaning and social implications of technological and economic growth.' (LS 109) When media and the digital world become omnipresent, their influence can stop people from learning how to live wisely, to think deeply, and to love generously. (LS 47) Politics must not be subject to the economy, nor should the economy be subject to the dictates of an efficiency driven paradigm of technocracy." (LS 189) Intergenerational solidarity is not optional, but rather a basic question of justice. The environment is on loan to each generation, which must then hand it on to the next." (LS 159)

Justice calls for a new view, one which starts with human beings. Humanity is called to recognize the need for a change of lifestyle, production, and consumption." (LS 23)

This week 's suggested actions:

- Begin (or continue) a habit of prayer, daily at least 10 minutes.
 Especially pray for courage to make the changes necessary "to transform our hearts, our lifestyles, and the public policies ruling our societies."
 - "Pray to see technology as an instrument rather than the dominant model. "
 - Pray for those who hold positions of power and agency to act justly, especially with regards to international climate negotiations.
- Encourage conversations about climate change and its effects on the lives of the people of developing countries.
- Join a group that is working for justice.

The Roof Project Is Finished

Three contractors bid on the project. It was awarded to Parker Johnston (PJ) in Feb. 2022, but the work could not be completed that summer because of rainy weather, the impacts of Covid, and a heavy work load for the PJ. The price of the original bid was increased from \$190,000 to \$203,000 due to increases in materials costs.

The previous shake roof was installed in 1994. That was the first time that the Church had been re-roofed since its original construction in 1965, thus 29 years for the original roof.

During the 1995 project a total of 2.5" of rigid insulation was installed over the entire roof area of 6500 square feet. This roof lasted until 2023 or 29 years as well.

A 22 Gauge, Kynar coated standing seam metal roof was installed during this project and should last well over 50 years.

During the scope-setting portion of the project we analyzed the carbon emission benefit of adding more insulation and it was determined that the energy savings would not significantly lessen the building's overall carbon footprint. It is necessary to compare the energy/carbon savings from reduced heating requirements against the energy/carbon required to make and install the insulation. The Church is only occupied for short periods of time so energy savings are not very great. Also, the metal roofing option has the lowest Carbon Footprint in comparison to the other commercial roofing options considered such as Duroid or Rubber. Another consideration is that Electric Solar Panels can easily be installed on this type of metal roof.

Extra work on the project consisted of covering the external exposed wooden structural beams with metal cladding, installing new downspouts that should handle the high-water volume during heavy rains, and fixing some of the flashings on the adjacent flat roofs. These extras came at a cost of \$21,585.00.

Parker Johnston was very easy to manage and executed the project without any first-aid incidents or injuries. Their performance was excellent.

To show gratitude to Parker Johnston and their Crews, the newly formed Marian Prayer Group will be saying a St. Joseph the Worker Novena, starting in early October, for their safety and welfare. They perform work in high risk environments and are very conscientious. Please include them in your prayers as well.


