Faith In What?

BY JEAN ALLEN

At the end of this week's Gospel passage, Jesus wonders, "And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" This particularly struck me when I was going over the Gospel before sitting down to write. Faith could well be difficult for him to find because we tend to define faith in a way he does not. We just need to look at our day-to-day struggles and problems to know that our faith is not terribly active because we are so focused on solving our own problems and trying to control our situations and the people around us. We have a way we think things should be going and when people and circumstances don't get the memo then we might pray and ask God to give everyone and everything a boot in the right direction. We have a kind of faith all right, but it's more of a faith in what we think needs to happen and how it needs to get there rather than a faith in the loving power of God who knows more than we do and doesn't subscribe to anyone's politics, religious perspectives or personal preferences...so much of our faith is squandered on personal preferences!

Do we pray for justice? Yes, we do, if it's justice for the side that we are on. We forget that God's justice is not retributive; it's restorative. We forget that his justice is for all, not just one side. We forget he is on the side of the poor ones, the hurting ones and the struggling ones and it doesn't matter if they are on the 'right' side. His restoration is for all.

When we pray for what we think should be happening, it's quite possible our prayers will not be answered – not in a way that is acceptable to us anyway. But if our prayers and our knocking on heaven's door is for God's brand of justice and for our ability to forgive and share the love, that's entirely different.

Those are prayers he can't resist.







Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight. Feb. 16



Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit

Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana - the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor - the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.



Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.

Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross -Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.



Feb. 20 After breakfast we visit Bethlehem - where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome - Shepherd's field. In the afternoon we continue our visit of Jerusalem's Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight.

Feb. 21 This morning we leave for a full day excursion to the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947, and Jericho. Time for floating before our return to hotel for dinner and overnight. Feb. 22



After breakfast we depart to Mount of Olives in Jerusalem where we visit the Church of all Nations, the Church of Maria Magdalene, Dominus Flevit Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, Mary's Tomb, Church of the Pater Noster, Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight
