### Let Them All Come

There is a strange juxtaposition of two events in today's Gospel. In the first part, Jesus evades the Pharisees challenge regarding divorce and



in the second part, Jesus is telling the disciples to let the little children come to him. It's not readily apparent but in both parts Jesus was displaying solidarity with two very vulnerable and downtrodden segments of the Jewish society: women and children.

The Jews had built up a multitude of laws regarding divorce and these laws favoured men and were not kind to women. It was extremely easy for a man to divorce his wife just by saying, "I divorce you," leaving her in poverty with no rights whatsoever. I'm not sure what woman would risk divorcing her husband under those circumstances! Children, too, had absolutely no status or rights.

Jesus' heart is always in solidarity with the poor, the downtrodden, the abused, the ones who seem not to matter and the ones who are left without resources when it comes to injustice. When Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them: for it is to such as these that the Kingdom of heaven belongs," he was not only speaking about children; he was speaking about the powerless. The Kingdom is a life where power is not valued, status holds no sway and those who are abused in any way are welcomed in to find warm shelter and receive dignity and love.

Jesus is there welcoming every small one in. He gathers each one in his arms.

And he blesses them.
