## The Skandalon Of Faith

There's desire and then there's motivation.

I suspect that when the disciples asked Jesus to increase their faith, Jesus knew that their motivations for that request weren't entirely good. Just prior to this passage, Jesus warned his disciples not to be an obstacle to any of his little ones and then talks again about the importance of forgiveness. The Greek word for obstacle is 'skandalon' and there are many times in the Gospels where Jesus warns against skandalon or obstacles or stumbling blocks. His warning is: don't ever cause someone else to stumble because of your actions, attitudes, and especially your inability to forgive.

Why would a desire for an increase in faith be a potential skandalon for other people? Here's where motivation comes in. What did the disciples want to do with an increase in faith? Receive praise for being healers? Have the ability to multiply loaves and fishes for themselves at will? Call down mountains on top of the hated Romans? Were they really looking to be humble and loving servants or were they looking to gain admiration and status? Did they want to lord it over people they disapproved of or over people who labelled them as worthless fishermen? There are so many ways the desire for powerful faith can cause stumbling blocks within the ones who desire that faith and in those who may witness the manifestations of that faith.

I'm pretty sure Jesus was just waiting for his disciples to request an increase in wisdom or an increase in the grace to forgive but, like all of us, they were going through their struggles trying to figure out what it really meant to follow Jesus. They still thought it was all about power and glory and great accomplishments like planting mulberry trees in the sea. Things like that will wow the crowds but not necessarily further the expansion of the Kingdom.

What will really further that expansion? Graciously do what you are required to do and expect no adulation or status or praise.

Be a servant. The Kingdom will flourish.



# PILGRIMAGE TO HOLY LAND

Feb. 14 Morning departure from Victoria to Tel Aviv.

- Feb. 15 Morning arrival in Tel Aviv. Upon meeting our guide we embark on a panoramic view of Jaffa and are transferred to our hotel in Galilee. Time for rest, dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 16 After breakfast we depart for Tiberias. We travel by boat on the Sea of Galilee, visit Capernaum, home of St. Peter and the site of Jesus' preaching, on to Tabgha to see the Church of the Multiplication with its beautiful 5th century fish mosaic. We also visit the Church of the Primacy and celebrate Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes. On our way back to the hotel we stop at the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 17 This morning we start our tour in Cana the site of Jesus' first miracle. Here we celebrate a marriage renewal ceremony. We move on to Nazareth where we celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the Annunciation and we visit Mary's Well and St. Joseph's Carpentry Shop. In the afternoon we ascend Mount Tabor the Mount of the Transfiguration. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 18 Today we depart Galilee for Judea and the area of Jerusalem. En route we visit Haifa and Mt. Carmel, the "burning place" where Elijah called fire down to confound the prophets of Baal. Here we celebrate Mass. We continue via Cesarea by the Sea to Judea for our dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 19 Today's journey takes us to the ancient city of Jerusalem: St. Ann's Church, Pool of Bethesda, Pilate's Judgment Hall, the Chapel of the Flagellation and the Arch of Ecce Homo, the convent of the sisters of Zion. We continue with the Stations of the Cross – Via Dolorosa to the Holy Sepulchre. Mass will be celebrated in one of the many churches of Jerusalem. In the afternoon we visit the Western Wall, also called the "Wailing Wall". We see the place of the Mosque of Omar and El Aksar and move on to the Church of Pater Noster and the Garden of Gethsemane.
- Feb. 20 After breakfast we visit Bethlehem where Jesus was born, celebrating Christmas Mass in one of the grottos. We visit the Manger, the Crusaders' Cloister and the Grotto of St. Jerome – Shepherd's field. In the afternoon we continue our visit of Jerusalem's Mount Zion with the Upper Room (Room of the Last Supper) and the Church of St. Peter's in Gallicantu. Dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 21 This morning we leave for a full day excursion to the Dead Sea, Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in 1947, and Jericho. Time for floating before our return to hotel for dinner and overnight.
- Feb. 22 After breakfast we depart to Mount of Olives in Jerusalem where we visit the Church of all Nations, the Church of Maria Magdalene, Dominus Flevit Church, Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, Mary's Tomb, Church of the Pater Noster. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight
- Feb. 23 This morning we are transferred to the airport in Tel Aviv for a flight to Victoria. Evening arrival.
