

and the son who said he would go but then didn't, Jesus was implying that the son who said he would go but then didn't was representative of the chief priests and elders. This would have been a bit shocking to the common folk present because it would seem obvious to them that these religious authorities were absolutely in God's vineyard following God's orders. It was definitely shocking to the priests and elders. Couldn't Jesus see that they were scrupulously obeying God's laws, serving in the temple and doing all that was required?

Sure, they were – on the outside. They wore their religion like a suit of armor that hid their hearts. It's easy to come to this state of being. They may have started out with hearts that only wanted to be servants in the vineyard but bit by bit along the way they lost the vision. Their spirituality slowly became religious observance and they forgot who they really were. It came to a point where they felt that if they performed all the right outward actions and mouthed the right words, that meant they were right with God. This was a more dangerous position than the positions of the tax collectors and prostitutes who had turned away from the right path to a life of sin. Why? Because the priests and elders were sure of their own righteousness and did not believe they had any need to change or be saved.

The tax collector and prostitutes that Jesus encountered, on the other hand, seemed to be very aware of their brokenness and their need for redemption. They initially had made choices that seemed to say no to God but Jesus saw their thirst. He responded to their desire to be with him, to talk to him, to be healed by him, to hear his teachings and follow him the best they could. This humility, desire and thirst was what would lead them into the Kingdom before the religious authorities.

There's a difference between right actions and right hearts.


